




#### Success stories

Fatima's Journey to Motherhood:

A Touching Tale of Hope and Resilience Fatima, a woman from Doan District, had not been blessed with a child for 25 years. A glimmer of hope for pregnancy appeared when she learned about the follow-up services offered at the women's and maternity clinic in the primary health care center during a visit to her neighbor who had given birth after six years of marriage. Fatima visited the center and underwent follow-up with the specialist doctor through the use of medications. However, the long period of miscarriage was not a motivating factor for her to continue follow-up with the specialist doctor. She was absent from the center for a year and did not return except to complain of fever symptoms. She entered the internal medicine clinic, but one of the positives of the center was the electronic storage of patient files. Therefore, the doctor noticed that Fatima had been following up with an obstetrician-gynecologist, so he referred her directly to the same doctor who performed various tests on her, including a pregnancy test. The result was a beacon of hope and a new turn in the life of Fatima, who will become a mother, God willing, after a quarter-century of patience.






The phrase "pain amidst hope" perfectly encapsulates the story of Nusrine, a brilliant immigrant student who chose to volunteer in teaching young children the Quran as part of her application for the "New Horizons Leaders" scholarship. Each evening, she would traverse the rugged terrain with her father on a motorcycle to reach the designated memorization circles, aspiring to crown her parents with the honor of instilling the word of God in the minds of young girls.

On one fateful evening, she and her father were involved in a horrific car accident on their way to the mosque. Her father succumbed to his injuries a few days later, leaving Nisreen in a state of profound shock and guilt. She felt responsible for her father's death, believing that it occurred during her volunteer work, which he took immense pride in.

Overwhelmed by this tragedy, she struggled to move forward until she realized that her father's greatest wish was for her to graduate and obtain a bachelor's degree. With newfound determination, she returned to her studies, fueled by the image of her father's pride in her.

As a testament to her resilience and unwavering spirit, Nisreen was awarded the "Nahal" Challenge Shield for Overcoming Adversities, an honor bestowed upon individuals who demonstrate exceptional strength and perseverance in overcoming obstacles.

Just as Nisreen's journey to the mosque with her father was arduous, so too was her path to achieving her aspirations. Yet, like the smooth and serene path that unfolds after overcoming challenges, Nisreen's story is one of triumph and unwavering determination.
