





Salem Bin Mahfouz Private Schools Project represents a strategic investment in the future of education in rural areas.











Refugee Education Al-Basateen Area Aden - Al-MuKalla Hadramout


Albert Einstein Scholarship for Refugee Students (DAFI)

Technical Education and Vocational Training Development Support Program

This project aims to enhance the quality of intermediate education in the field of refrigeration and air conditioning at the Technical and Industrial Institute in MuKalla as an initial phase of the foundation's strategic direction, which extends over five years.

Technical Education and Vocational Training Development Support Program

This project aims to lay the foundation and establish scientific principles to advance the field of solar energy at the Community College in Seiyun, building on scientific studies that highlighted the importance of this field. This prompted the foundation to intervene in its development by enhancing the department's infrastructure with modern devices and equipment, updating the curriculum to Keep pace with rapid advancements in the field, and preparing a qualified faculty capable of achieving the foundation's objectives. The project seeKs to advance the specialization and graduate sKilled professionals who will contribute to the development of the renewable energy sector in Yemen.



Additionally, it supports sustainable development goals by improving the health and well-being of the community and enhancing access to high-quality healthcare services





This role reflects the hospital's commitment to achieving sustainable health and well-being, aligning with sustainable development goals, particularly health and quality of life.








The Mobile Medical Clinic

The mobile medical clinic, funded by Al-Awn Foundation for Development for over 15 years, is a local model aligned with international best practices in providing community healthcare. It contributes to achieving the third Sustainable Development Goal (SDG), which is focused on good health and well-being.

This clinic delivers essential and comprehensive health services to all segments of society, positively impacting their quality of life and enabling their active participation in the community.

In the context of rapid disaster response, the clinic is highly flexible in its operations, allowing it to reach affected areas immediately following cyclones and weather-related depressions. Additionally, the clinic offers its services to pilgrims during the Hajj season at the Al-Wadi'ah border crossing, monitoring their health conditions until they depart Yemeni territory.

The project aspires to establish a sustainable health culture that enables rural communities to access basic healthcare services without the need to resort to major medical centers. This contributes to enhancing public health and achieving a high level of health well-being. This approach represents a step toward achieving sustainable development goals by focusing on Goal 3 related to health and well-being, ensuring that everyone has access to preventive and promotive healthcare services close to their communities.

The project contributed to enhancing the sustainability of the beneficiary organizations and improving their efficiency, reflecting significant success in building a robust civil society capable of achieving sustainable development in Hadramout.

At the conclusion of the program, participants received certified diplomas from AMIDEAST, along with the opportunity to join the AMIDEAST Leaders Network (ALAM), which comprises over 2,000 professionals and mentors. This network provides participants with opportunities to connect with international experts and supporters, thereby strengthening their ability to make a greater impact in their communities.

Widad's Story: Hope Born in the Toughest Moments

Widad, a 20-year-old displaced young woman, lives in the Sam'oon camp in the Al-Shihr district. She carried her hopes and dreams for a better future along her journey of displacement, but her path was not without challenges. Widad, in her ninth month of pregnancy, was experiencing persistent pain in the area of a previous cesarean section she had undergone a few months before this pregnancy.

ThanKs to the Mobile Medical Clinic Project, Widad was able to access specialized medical care within the camp. When she visited the clinic, the gynecologist accurately diagnosed her condition as a «uterine rupture,» a severe condition requiring immediate intervention.

The mobile clinic wasted no time and referred Widad directly to AI-Shihr General Hospital. There, she underwent an emergency cesarean section performed by a skilled medical team, saving both her life and the life of her newborn son, Bassam. In that moment, hope was reborn.

Today, Widad feels profound gratitude for the critical role the mobile medical clinic played, not only in saving her life but also in bringing hope and relief to thousands of women and families in the camps. She proudly shares her story as a testament to the life-saving impact of the mobile medical clinic, which creates new opportunities filled with hope.



When Tears Revealed the Truth...

In a remote village in the northwest of Hadramout Governorate called Al-Dhalia'a, lived a young boy named Mohammed with his family. Mohammed, a small child prone to frequent crying, rarely quieted either day or night, causing great concern for his parents and presenting an ongoing challenge to the family. Searching for answers, the family heeded their neighbors advice and decided to visit the primary healthcare center in the Al-Hajrain area.

Traveling two hours to the center, they arrived with hope for an explanation and relief from Mohammed's continuous crying. Upon their arrival, they were warmly received by Dr. Asrar Lardi, a pediatric consultant Known for her exceptional listening skills and analytical approach. With her extensive expertise, Dr. Lardi conducted a comprehensive examination of Mohammed, uncovering a previously unnoticed issue. In addition to a minor chest infection, she identified that Mohammed was experiencing hearing impairment, a condition requiring specialized intervention.

Dr. Lardi recommended referring him to a specialized hearing center for further evaluation to pinpoint the exact nature of the problem and develop a suitable treatment plan. The family continued their journey to Mukalla, where advanced tests revealed that Mohammed was suffering from hearing loss requiring a cochlear implant surgery. Despite their natural fears about the procedure, the emotional support and reassurance provided by the medical team gave the family the confidence to proceed with the operation.

Today, Mohammed is two and a half years old. He speaks clearly and enjoys a happier, calmer childhood. His treatment journey became an inspiring story, and the primary healthcare center in Al-Hajareen has become an essential part of the family's life. Despite the distance, the family continues their visits to the center, trusting in the expertise and dedication of the medical team.

Mohammed's story is a living testament to the importance of comprehensive and continuous healthcare. It demonstrates how trust and medical support can open doors to hope and growth, even in the most remote areas.



Access to Education in Rural Areas:

Transforming Dreams into Opportunities and Integrated Edu

In remote villages nestled between hills and farms, where educational opportunities seem scarce and the dreams of young girls are confined to traditional roles, the Access to Education in Rural Areas project emerged as a new and promising window of hope. The project targeted high school graduate girls, offering them not only the chance to work as teachers in their own villages but also equipping them with the necessary skills to become educational leaders in their communities, laying the foundation for sustainable education in rural areas.

Thanks to this project, their educational journey no longer ended with academic learning. The program included life skills training, enabling the new teachers to develop their social abilities, communication skills, and planning capabilities—essential qualities for their roles as educators and leaders in the villages. Each of them became a symbol of ambition, teaching their students not only reading and writing but also principles of self-confidence and managing daily challenges.

The transformation didn't stop there. With qualified teachers emerging from within the villages, families began to view education with greater optimism. Parents started seeing their daughters as agents of change and progress, contributing to reduced school dropout rates and increased interest in education.

The trust between the community and the project grew stronger, as parents saw how educating girls was no longer just about attending school but had become an investment in the village's present and future.

Today, the project continues to create this profound impact, not just by providing job opportunities but by offering an integrated educational model that fosters values and sKills. The success stories born daily in these villages prove that investing in girls education and empowering them to become teachers is a vital step towards building a stronger community capable of addressing the challenges of tomorrow.



Empowering Civil Society Organizations Project (Tadamon)

As part of efforts to enhance development and community work, the Empowering Civil Society Organizations Project emerged as a pivotal initiative for building the capacities of local organizations.

The project aims to support organizations through professional consultations and specialized training across various fields, enabling these organizations to improve their performance and achieve their goals more effectively.

The journey began when a development-focused organization decided to benefit from the project's support by receiving a consultation to develop a comprehensive procurement policy. This policy became a critical step toward improving transparency and fairness in selecting suppliers and contractors. By implementing this policy, the organization enhanced its credibility and efficiency in dealings with partners and suppliers, opening new opportunities for its development projects.

In another case, a different organization benefited from training in monitoring and evaluation, which helped refine its performance tracking methods and project result assessments. By applying effective models learned during the training, the organization became better equipped to achieve its operational goals and systematically improve its plans.

Additionally, one organization took advantage of strategic thinking training provided by the project, enabling it to develop a comprehensive strategic plan. Using the Pro PMD methodology for project management, the organization significantly improved all aspects of its project implementation, from planning to effective execution. Another organization received training in digital marketing and registration on international platforms such as "Tadamon for Crowdfunding" and "Portal 360". This opened up new opportunities for accessing international funding and executing larger projects.

Several organizations also secured membership on global donor platforms such as «UN Partner Portal» and «Ensany», boosting their ability to attract financial and technical support for their projects.

Thanks to the efforts of the Tadamon project, many local organizations overcame challenges related to management, planning, and funding. This support significantly improved organizational performance and helped achieve developmental objectives, contributing to improving the quality of life in local communities and advancing sustainable development initiatives.
